<p>Guest Speakers</p>	<p><u>Jodi Oscroft – Teacher: Eco School</u></p> <p>Crystal (school Head Custodian), Suzanne and Jodi, have applied for Angus Morrison Elementary to be an ECO School. Which a Canadian wide program to work toward specific goals, to help the environment and earn badges. The school sets the goals that they want to achieve based on what is happening at the school. Goals set by Angus Morrison, reducing take out cups, reducing water bottles and consistently using recycling and green bins in the classrooms. An Eco team made of students and staff members will be formed to help facilitate and encourage achievement of these goals. Suggestions for other goals welcome.
