Diseases of Public Health Significance: Measles - Measles is the world's most contagious human respiratory virus that spreads through the air indoors without needing to be close to someone who is infectious. It can quickly spread among people who are unvaccinated. For more information about symptoms and immunization visit Measles www.simcoe.muskoka.health.org.

What will happen if there is a case or outbreak of measles at school?

When a case or outbreak of measles is reported at a school the health unit investigates. Health unit staff assess and determine potential risk and provide relevant recommendations such as infection prevention and control measures and/or whether there are staff or students that need to be excluded from school. The school principal or designate may be contacted for information to help inform the investigation (e.g. class lists, buses, attendance, etc.).

If communication is recommended, the health unit will work with the school principal and/or school board to ensure that students, families, and school staff are properly notified. The purpose of communication is to provide important information and guidance for those who may have been exposed. We do not provide specific information or identifying details to protect privacy and avoid disclosure that may lead to the identification of any individual.

School boards and schools are asked not to communicate information about measles to the school community without consulting the health unit. This helps to ensure sharing of accurate information and guidance for protecting themselves and their families.

SOLAR ECLIPSE

April 8, 2024

ECLIPSE BEGINS



PARTIAL ECLIPSE MAXIMUM

MOST LOCATIONS ACROSS CANADA WILL SEE A PARTIAL ECLIPSE AT THE MAXIMUM. A SMALL SLIVER OF THE SUN WILL ALWAYS REMAIN.

TOTAL ECLIPSE MAXIMUM

ALONG THE PATH OF TOTALITY, AT THE ECLIPSE MAXIMUM, THE MOON COMPLETELY BLOCKS OUT THE SUN. JUST THE SUN'S CORONA IS VISIBLE.



ECLIPSE ENDS

1 WHAT'S HAPPENING?

This eclipse is a total eclipse. At its maximum, the Moon completely blocks out the Sun. This only happens in the path of the Moon's shadow, called the **path of totality**. Everywhere except this path will see a partial eclipse (like in Simcoe County) in which a sliver of the Sun will remain visible.

2 WHEN WILL IT HAPPEN?

From beginning to end, the eclipse will be visible for about 2.5 hours. At eclipse maximum, the sky will darken. In Simcoe County, only a sliver of the Sun will remain. This will only last for a few minutes!

3 HOW RARE IS THIS EVENT?

Very! The next total eclipse will occur in 2044 - but you will need to travel to the arctic or western Canada to see it. The next total eclipse traveling through Ontario will be in 2106. That's 72 years from now! How old will your students be when that happens?

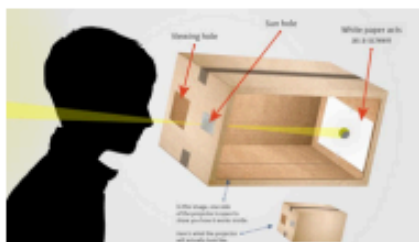

4 SAFETY & EYE PROTECTION

Never look at the sun with the unaided eye, including during an eclipse! Light from the Sun will injure your eyes and could damage your eyesight forever. Not even sunglasses are sufficient in protecting your eyes.
