## Revised 2023 Ontario Language Curriculum

Beginning this school year, all language programs for Grades 1-8 will be based on the expectations of the revised Ontario Language Curriculum. The Ontario Curriculum, Grades 1 to 8: Language, 2023 outlines the knowledge and skills required for effective reading and writing, listening, and speaking so students can succeed at school and beyond. The curriculum has been revised partly in response to the recommendations outlined in the Ontario Human Rights Commission's Right to Read public inquiry report.

The 2023 curriculum now includes four strands:

- 1. Literacy Connections and Applications
- 2. Foundations of Language
- 3. Comprehension: Understanding and Responding to Texts
- 4. Composition: Expressing Ideas and Creating Texts

Below is a summary of the activities planned for the Oct. 20 PA Day:

**Length:** Full day

**Topic:** Health and Safety, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, and Mathematics

**Host:** Simcoe County District School Board

Presenter(s)/facilitator(s): School board staff and school administrators and school leads

Educators will participate in a half-day Health and Safety digital learning session focused on health and safety incident reporting and investigations with a particular emphasis on the essential aspect of workplace violence prevention. The session will equip staff with the knowledge and tools to report incidents effectively and promptly, provide insights into the investigative and risk mitigation process, fostering transparency and accountability, and highlight the critical role staff play in preventing workplace injuries.

Educators will learn about Somali, Latino, South Asian, and African Black Indigenous heritage. They will collaboratively plan within grades and divisions. Through this, they will celebrate identities and create environments that foster well-being and sense of belonging.

Educators will choose learning related to the Knowledgehook digital math tool based on their readiness. Different learning pathways have been planned for new users, those with some experience, and those who are ready to extend their use of the math tool. All participants will learn about how to invite parents/guardians to view their child's progress. Additionally, educators will engage in High Impact Instructional Practices in Mathematics learning modules that align with their school's Achievement in Mathematics goal.

# Boomerang Lunches at AMES!

In alignment with our goals to reduce waste at AMES, beginning in **October**, we will be following a boomerang lunch program.

This means that <u>all</u> waste coming in lunches will be sent home. We hope that this initiative sparks more waste free lunch choices, when possible.

#### Boomerang Lunch – Frequently Asked Questions

#### What is a boomerang lunch?

A boomerang lunch is a lunch that has every piece of it returned to its source, home! In other words, everything in the lunch goes back home at the end of the day. No matter if it is leftover food, containers, recyclables or garbage, it all goes back to be washed, recycled, or disposed of at home.



#### What can I do to ensure my child doesn't come home with a messy lunch bag?

The number one choice is to send all food items in sealable reusable containers. Therefore, the only items returning in the lunch bag will be in sealed containers ready to be washed and used the next day. If you choose to send disposable containers such as yogurt, apple sauce, and juice boxes, your child will be encouraged to place the empty containers in a resealable bag to be returned home.

#### Isn't waste just being diverted home and then thrown in the garbage?



The eco-team feels that it is our responsibility to teach the students the number one best option for our environment. This is reducing waste. The purpose of the boomerang program is to promote the use of reusable containers, thus reducing the amount of lunch waste being produced by our school. The collection, transportation, and processing of garbage as well as recyclable materials requires a significant amount of energy, putting strain on our environment.

#### Boomerang Lunch Tips

#### BULK UP!

Choose to buy food that is not over-packaged by buying items in bulk rather than single use containers and placing them daily in re-sealable containers. Example – buy the large yogurt containers and put it into a re-sealable container.

#### LET NATURE WRAP YOUR FOOD FOR YOU!

Oranges, bananas, apples and hard-boiled eggs all come with their own handy packaging.

#### CHOOSE A PERMANENT PACKAGING SOLUTION

Pack a waste-free lunch using items such as:

- reusable lunch bag or box (look for a hard plastic interior, as it can easily be wiped clean)
- thermoses
- reusable water bottles
- reusable plastic containers
- cloth napkins
- reusable utensils

#### AVOID THE FEROCIOUS FIVE WEAPONS OF WASTE!

- 1. plastic: sandwich bags, plastic wrap, utensils
- 2. yogurt, pudding, apple sauce cups
- 3. drink boxes, drink pouches, pop cans
- throw away paper bags
- 5. aluminum foil



#### **Upcoming in-person Grade 1 French Immersion information sessions**

The Simcoe County District School Board (SCDSB) offers French Immersion (FI) at select schools throughout Simcoe County beginning in Grade 1. The goal of the FI program is to enable students to communicate in French with a high level of proficiency, enabling them to function with ease in both English and French. Information sessions for families who are considering entry into Grade 1 FI for the 2024-25 school year will take place at Ferndale Woods, 170 Ferndale Drive South, Barrie, Tuesday November 15th at 6pm, and online applications will open in December 2023.

Entry into the FI program will be determined through a digitally randomized lottery system. A link to access the Grade 1 FI online application form will be available on the SCDSB website starting at 9 a.m. on Friday, Dec. 1 until 4 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 15. ## **Parking At Angus Morrison**

Many of you are aware of the congestion during pick up and drop off times. Safety is our primary concern.

### Please follow these procedures during pick up and drop off times:

Consider parking on our side streets and walking from there. Remind your child to cross the street at stop signs and use the newly installed crosswalks.

# Our parking lots are closed from 9:00—9:30am and again in the afternoon from 3:15—3:45pm.

Be patient and allow our buses and school vans to pull in and out of their parking areas. DO NOT try to squeeze past or block their entry/exit.

Grades 1-8 walkers, please enter and exit the school yard on Simcoe Street. Bussed students will enter and exit on Sydenham Street as well as the Kindergarten students. Parents, please follow these procedures as it helps tremendously to keep pick up and drop off times organized and running smoothly. Thanks to all our families for your understanding and patience when using our parking lot/driveway to pick up and drop off students.

## Potential Student Transportation Delays

In order to receive delay and cancellation notifications, families can check the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC) website at <a href="https://www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca">www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca</a> or download the 'BusPlanner Delays' app from the Apple or Android app stores to receive delay notifications to their devices. Users would need to select Simcoe County STC as the transportation authority. The app will need to be forced closed, but you will be able to select your student(s) routes or school to receive delays. The app will send a general notice for any cancellation in Simcoe County. You only need to know which 'zone' you're in, so you would know which one to look out for in the app. You can find your student's zone by visiting the School Bus Status page at <a href="https://www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca">www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca</a> and clicking the dropdown for the area you live in.

## Inclement Weather And Bus Cancellation Reminder

All information regarding cancelled buses in Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC)'s bus information website at <a href="www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca">www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca</a>. Our school is in the Central Zone. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open for student learning, unless otherwise noted. School staff are expected to plan for such emergencies in order to transition students who are unable to attend due to inclement weather, to their online platforms (Google Classroom and/or SCDSBhub [Brightspace by D2L]) and continue with academic programming. It is always a family decision whether or not it is safe for their child(ren) to leave for school under severe weather conditions.

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. 
